BPD (Borderline Personality Disorder)

BPD (Borderline Personality Disorder) is a serious mental illness characterized by intense and stormy relationships, low self-esteem, self-sabotaging acts and self-injury, rapid mood fluctuations and impulsivity. The hallmark of BPD is extreme difficulty managing emotions under stress. There is help. If you are the family member of someone with BPD you can get training to be a leader of a Family Connections course.

BPD family members who have graduated from NEA BPD's Family Connections or Tele-Connections class, graduates of NAMI Family-to-Family w/BPD loved one, and licensed mental health professionals with the commitment to co-lead at least two classes during the next 3 years may attend the Family Connections/Tele-Connections Leader Training in Houston this February.

This course will be taught by the course developers, Drs. Alan Fruzzetti and Perry Hoffman. The fee is \$125/person and training is on Saturday and Sunday, February 9-10.
